Language: Phrasal Verbs Skills: Speaking Topic: Relationships

Level: B1 - B1+ - Age: 16+



Lead in

Ask your students to discuss the following:

- Is there only one perfect partner for each one of us?
- Is it possible to be faithful to one person for a lifetime?
- Why are modern relationships falling apart so easily nowadays?

Introduction to the target language

The students are going to read the love story of a couple.

Reveal the story little by little so that the students can predict what is going to happen next in order to maintain their interest.

Note: If you have an IWB or a projector this can be done as a whole class, projecting the story little by little on the board. If not, cut the story in slips of paper. See below.

I met John when I was in secondary school but we were so different that we didn't hit it off. In high school we started hanging out more and finally when we both got into college we started dating. At first we got along really well and soon we decided to move in together. However, a few months later our relationship started having its ups and downs. John was jealous of me and we used to fall out over minor things. The constant arguments and his jealousy drifted us apart and we finally split up. Neither of us had any hard feelings, so we kept in touch. A year later John was offered a job in Paris and he asked me to go with him and make a fresh start. I turned down his proposal but he kept calling me and sending me postcards from Paris. After I had told him about my new boyfriend, Ben, we lost touch. I hadn't seen John for 4 years until last week when I bumped into him outside Holborn station. We were both in a hurry, so we arranged to meet up the following day. I was really excited and I was hoping we could get back together since I had broken up with Ben. We went to a beautiful small café and I opened up about my feelings straight away. John told me that he had settled down and now he had a wife and a kid. I felt so awkward and so did he. He left hastily and I ended up sitting at the café all by myself.



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Neither of us had any hard feelings so we **kept in touch**. A year later John was offered a job in Paris and he asked me to go with him and make a fresh start.

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After you finish reading the story, ask the students to discuss the following:

- Can you guess the meaning of the **phrasal verbs** from the context? Can you come up with any synonyms?
- Are there phrasal verbs that are synonyms/opposites?
- In relation to form only, what's the difference between drifted us apart and bumped into him?

In relation to **meaning,** students should probably know most of them (though they might not be in their active vocabulary) so focus on those students have problems with.

In relation to **use**, you might want to ask them if they often hear people use phrasal verbs and whether they are considered formal or informal.

In relation to **form**, you might want to draw a distinction between separable and inseparable phrasal verbs.

Finally, students will probably have no problems with the **pronunciation** of the individual words but you may want to mention the feature of connected speech to sound more natural.

Controlled Practice

Looking at the story, students work in pairs and match the Phrasal Verbs to their meaning.
